A Note from our Director, Gaby Saxton:

This show represents the end for some of my most beloved company members. This 8th grade graduating class will be extremely hard to say goodbye to in the spring. I have helped raise them - some since they were five - as their parent cooper, teacher, director, and finally friend. This does not mean I don't love all my actors and crew…but every once in a while you get a set that is so special that it is painful to see them go. There are three kids especially amazing to me in this production and I will openly admit I chose this show for them.

One, of course, is my own son, Kirby. He represents the last Saxton actor to come through the OC. I started doing OC Drama for my eldest son, but continued for my youngest. As they say about Charlie Brown in the opening song, "you were made for this part"- so is Kirby. He starts his adventure toward adulthood but he will always have OC Drama, and me, behind him in whatever he tries. And he will never have a bigger fan than me! My favorite moment in this show comes at the end of the first song when Kirbo holds a 20 second note and does it beautifully.

I knew Gabrielle Grundvig would be the perfect Lucy - although Gabrielle is the farthest from Lucy in real life as you can get- but I have never had an actor pay attention, learn, and strive harder to become the best actress she could be in my time as a Director. Every moment Gabs is on stage she is working to be her best. Nobody has better diction, reaches higher, or gives more in their acting. Some may be better actors naturally but no-one gives more to their performances. Gaby will also work to follow directions and trust her directors even when she, herself, is not sure she can play the part. She was unsure she could "pull-off" Lucy, but Sissy and I knew. We told her she could and she did it with more heart and gusto than anyone else could. I am so proud to have given her a start in theatre and to have our opening night happen on her Mother's Birthday.

Often in theatre only actors get the applause, but make no mistake, Maisy Phelps is the heart of this department and it is time for her to take her bow (even if she has no desire to do so in front of any of you!). She loves this place and knows what I need even before I do. She is the hardest working member of our company and she is never seen on stage. Most of the time she hasn't even seen the shows from the audience's point of view but she knows them more intimately than anyone, including myself. Nothing - illness, Doctor's appointments, even her Father's passing - kept Maisy away from our theatre. I have never known a stronger person in my life and I tell her every day how much she means to me...but she will never understand. Her grace, commitment, and love of theatre makes me want to keep creating shows so that we may continue to provide a space for other kids as amazing as Maisy.

With all of the work being done on the building we did not know if we were going to have theatre this year. I have carried these three individuals in my heart, along with my other exceptional 8th graders whom I adore—Jordan, Emerson, Leo, Sarah, Dimitri, Jonah, Sam, Siobhan, Kiera, and Logon - as reasons to make it happen. I wanted these guys to have one last show and I wanted it to be *You're a Good Man Charlie Brown*.





in 5th grade and she has been in three plays, but the best one I've been in is Charlie Brown, especially



A Lil' History on "Peanuts" and You're a Good Man Charlie Brown...the Musical

In 1947 Charles Schulz started a cartoon feature called L'il Folks for the St. Paul Pioneer Press. It was a flop, never achieving a permanent spot in the paper. In 1950 he compiled his strips and sold the series to the United Features Syndicate, which changed its name to Peanuts. Schulz originally resisted the name change. "I wanted to keep Li'I Folks," he told TIME in 1965. "I wanted a strip with dignity and significance. Peanuts made it sound too insignificant".

Schulz introduced to the funny papers a group of children who told one another the truth:

"I have deep feelings of depression," a round-faced kid named Charlie Brown said to an imperious girl named Lucy in an early strip. "What can I do about it?"

"Snap out if it," advised Lucy.

This was something new in the newspaper comic strip. At mid-century the comics were dominated by action and adventure, vaudeville and melodrama, slapstick and gags. Schulz dared to use his own quirks — a lifelong sense of alienation, insecurity and inferiority — to draw the real feelings of his life and time. He brought a spare pen line, Jack Benny timing and a subtle sense of humor to taboo themes such as faith, intolerance, depression, loneliness, cruelty and despair. His characters were contemplative. They spoke with simplicity and force. They made smart observations about literature, art, classical music, theology, medicine, psychiatry, sports and the law.

Charlie Brown was something new in comics: a real person, with a real psyche and real problems. The reader knew him, knew his fears, and sympathized with his sense of inferiority and alienation. When Charlie Brown first confessed, "I don't feel the way I'm supposed to feel," he was speaking for people everywhere in America.

Schulz's Peanuts exploded during the 1960s, leaving its fingerprints on everything it touched. Charlie Brown and the gang even graced the cover of TIME in 1965.

In 1967, YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN opened on March 7th and played for 1,597 performances in New York at the theatre 80 St. Marks. A new revival version (the version seen here on our stage) was presented on Broadway in 1999 and played for 149 performances at the Ambassador Theatre with award-winning performances by Roger Bart and Kristin Chenoweth as Snoopy and Sally.

We hope you enjoy the Open Classroom Drama Department's interpretation of these characters and their stories.
